Course Description

This course covers the basics of landscape oil painting: materials such as paints, brushes, mediums, palettes, etc. The student learns how to set up colors on a palette, how to work with an easel, how to mix colors, color theory, how to stretch and prepare the canvas, how to paint on paper and other materials. The students will create landscape paintings from photos and observation by sketching with a brush and then working a painting up in stages. Other approaches such as direct painting with no preparatory sketch will be explored as well.

Learning Outcome

Students will become familiar with the concept of landscape painting theory and practice. Students will create landscape oil paintings using a limited palette of colors designed for the beginning student. Students will be able to select materials and work with canvas, brushes, and paint. Students will make both preliminary studies using underpaintings as well as learn the direct painting approach. Students will learn how to compose a landscape on the support surface using methods of composition.

Course Content

1. Introduction to the concept of a landscape oil painting
2. Sketching with the brush
3. Color mixing for landscape and working with the layout of paints on the palette.
4. Basic steps in building up a landscape oil painting starting from scratch
5. Perspective and atmosphere in a landscape
6. Creating a series of small landscape paintings on canvas, paper, board, and cardboard
